1. Programme Duration

5. Dissertation/Thesis Focus (Year 2)

Key Components:

3. **Empirical Research:** Collect and analyze data through field studies, surveys, experiments, or case studies.

4. Dissertation Writing: Document findings, implications, and recommendations for theory and practice.
5. Defense and Publication: Present research to faculty panel and publish in peer-reviewed journals.
